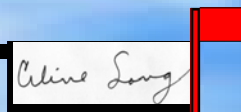
## FROM THE DIRECTOR'S DESK

## EVANS LIBRARY DISPLAYS



Beginning in December, materials from the Library's Sasha McInnes collection will be featured in a two-month first-floor lobby display. This renowned collection consists of approximately 1600 volumes that cover such topics as histories of the women's movement, art, and witchcraft, mental

well-being, feminism, the "men's movement", social change, and visual arts. The collected works, which address interests of clinicians, scholars, women, and local artists, also support the Florida Tech psychology and humanities curricula and research programs.

The popular "Beachcombing" display continues in the Library's north foyer. This display takes viewers on a trip to the seashore, highlighting both natural and man-made beach accumulations. Featured books, periodical articles, and references to Internet resources encompass everything from drift seeds to pollution to sea glass. Shells from the Department of Marine and Environmental Systems' Holman family shell collection are included in this display, as are fossilized ghost crabs from the Department of Biological Sciences.

## PERIODICAL TABLES OF CONTENTS TO THE DESKTOP

Florida Tech faculty may receive current tables of contents for up to 50 periodical titles, selected from over 27,000 publications, by email directly to the desktop. Called *Reveal*, this service is provided free to faculty. *Reveal* users can also create an interest profile that causes up to 25 searches to be run weekly against ALL 27,000 tables of contents, the results of which also show up in their email. ## UPCOMING HOURS

In conjunction with the final examination schedule, the Library will extend its hours in early December. From Monday, December 2, through Thursday, December 5, and from Sunday, December 8, through Thursday, December 12, the Library will open at its normal time, but will remain open until 2:00 a.m. On Friday, December 6, and Saturday, December 7, the Library will remain open until midnight.

Effective Saturday, December 14, through Monday, December 23, the Library will be on break schedule. This means that the Library will be open Monday through Friday from 9:00 a.m. until 5:00 p.m. and closed Saturday and Sunday. In keeping with the campus holiday schedule, the Library will close at noon on Tuesday, December 24. The Library will re-open at 9:00 a.m. on Thursday, January 2, 2003, and will be open break-schedule hours through Tuesday, January 7. Beginning Wednesday, January 8, when classes begin, the Library will be open during its normal semester hours.
